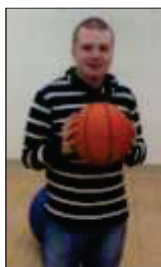

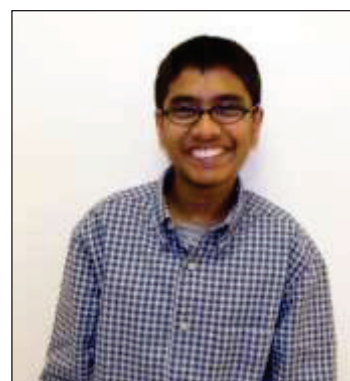
preciate the vital funding support provided by this Tournament. We were honored to be selected alongside LADDERS as a beneficiary of the event. See the article inside for more.

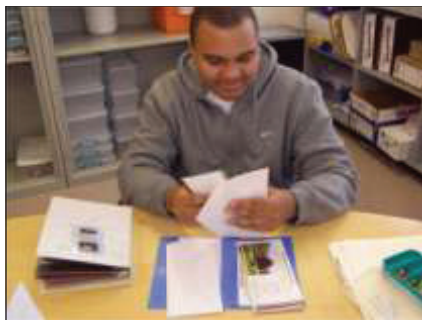

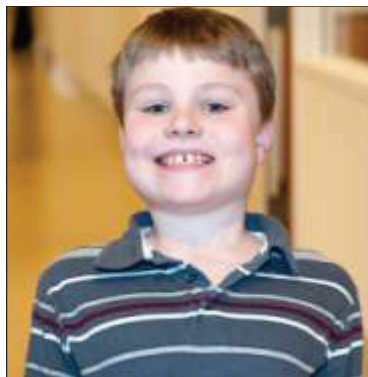
