It has been a busy and productive summer for NLG and our students! School continues and our students continued their individualized learning all summer long. Life at NLG is full of many small victories every day and we celebrate each and every one. From our newest students to those that have been with us for 7 years, we rejoice in their progress and their pride of achievement. NLG 9TH ANNUAL BIKE AND WALK A THON



NLG HOSTS INTERNATIONAL VISITORS

NLG had several opportunities to host professionals from other nations as part of our ongoing commitment to enhancing services for all those with autism. On August 16th we welcomed 25 Special Education professionals from Japan for a day of learning about our program. The group was organized and led by Keiichi Takeda, M.D. LD Center Advisor Osaka Medical College. In June we hosted Cherine Basfer, BCBA, from the JISH Clinic in Saudia Arabia for a 2 week internship. JISH, a speech and hearing clinic founded by Sultana Alireza has developed one of the first ABA programs in Jeddah, Saudia Arabia. And, NLG hosted Marie Penot, an Autism educator from France for a 2 week observation in July.

NLG AND TRIANGLE INDUSTRIES

NLG is pleased to announce that we have developed a working partnership with Triangle Inc. of Malden MA. Triangle provides employment and a full range of job related services to adults with disabilities, serving over 3,000 adults in Southern New England, most of them placed in competitive employment. Triangle operates its own contract fulfillment center in Malden that employs developmentally disabled adults. In the first stage of our partnership, Triangle is providing NLG with a variety of actual work projects to be completed each week at NLG by our students. These projects allow us to teach our Vocational students critical job skills. We are looking forward to expanding our relationship with Triangle over time, potentially having some NLG students work at the Triangle fulfillment center as part of their Vocational training. We are very pleased to be able to learn from Triangle's expertise in adult employment and to teach them about the needs of our students with autism. Triangle's mission of empowering those with disabilities through support, challenge and opportunity, and the uplifting, productive environment we observed at their facility, resonate with NLG's mission.
