NEW NEWS

We are excited to announce that we have leased a storefront space in the Great Road Shopping Center in Bedford. This 5,000 square foot space will allow us to expand our Adult Program by 20 adults over the next few years. The site will provide walkable community access to a variety of locations for our adults and will also be a community donation site that will provide volunteer opportunities. We will begin to use the site in December and rotate groups through the space each week.

Our Story Starts With you...

My name is Kathryn Judge. My son Ellis is 6 years old and has been at NLG since May of 2023. I imagine while unique to us, our family story echoes many of your own, which speaks volumes about the theme of this year's auction and the importance of our NLG community.

Our family story began in 2018 when Ellis barreled into the delivery room- almost 9 pounds, a full head of hair and a set of lungs that didn't quit. At that time our world was infinitely wide. Stroller walks with neighbors? Yes. Adoring glances from strangers at Market Basket? Absolutely. Families fawning, strangers cooing, Mike, Ellis, and I perfecting the family snuggle- it was magical & the possibilities endless.

Fast forward to the 12-month pediatrician check-up. The talk of speech delays and poor eye contact. Of lack of interest in other children and repetitive movements. The blue plate special of missed milestones. Five months later we had an ASD diagnosis and I began to feel pangs of pain when spending time with mom friends whose children played with other kids or said "I love you." During this time, other behaviors began. Biting. Hair pulling. Scratching. Bolting into the woods at Breakheart Reservation. Bolting in a parking garage. Our world inevitably eroded.

Profound autism is insidious in that way- slowly, social engagements and family rites of passages fell off the calendar and were replaced with therapy appointments. Family magnets- like farms and museums-were only visited during off hours or if the weather was opposite to what the NT family preferred. Farm trips on rainy days were our usual. Museums the opposite. I imagine many of you can relate.

By age 4, Ellis was bringing the public preschool in our hometown to its knees. Two full-time paraprofessionals were assigned to him and even so, he perfected his art of escape and his aggressions became more frequent, more intense and less predictable. Our world continued to shrink- neighborhood walks were abandoned. BBQ's with friends and their families that included other children were skipped. Neighborhood get-togethers were off limits. Even errands that at best can be considered socially adjacent, like trips to the grocery store or mall walks were off limits.

At this point, Mike and I knew an Out of District placement was our best chance to right Ellis's behavioral ship and we put on our investigative hats to find the gold standard of therapeutic schools. We didn't need Sherlock Holmes, Columbo, Scooby Doo, or Inspector Gadget to solve this mystery- All of our doctors and advisors sang the same tune- Ellis needed to be at Nashoba Learning Group. Full stop.

And on May 22, 2023 our family story began a new chapter, new characters and surely a happier ending. On our first day, Ellis became agitated in the lobby. Historically, I would steer him outside as quickly as possible so as to ensure aggressions didn't become a public spectacle or anyone who wasn't directly responsible for his presence on this Earth wouldn't be injured. I had danced this routine countless times. But what happened instead blew me out of the water. A smiling man who introduced himself as Marcus crouched to Ellis's eye level and started speaking calmly to him. In what seemed like both a second and a lifetime, Ellis went from Jack-in-TheBox ready to pounce to, well, not. He didn't aggress. He didn't flop. He didn't bolt. And that was thatMarcus smiled and continued up the stairs with the student with whom he was accompanying. In that one moment- our world became bigger. Because there was proof that it COULD be bigger. That our self-made family Alcatraz wasn't going to last forever. That there was hope. And that hope lived in the staff at Nashoba Learning Group.

And that brings me to what the NLG community means to our family. Recently, Ellis had some struggles at home that required a stay at an inpatient facility. Mike and I were bombarded with love and messages of support from our NLG family. Ellis's BCBA Amanda and former lead therapist, Emily even joined us in the hospital. While Mike and I struggled to think clearly, they filled in the clinical gaps to the endless parade of anonymous providers who documented Ellis's challenges, but who did not know our boy. NLG parents sent us meals, flowers, and practical advice about how to navigate these unknown waters. Even Liz Martineau reached out and reassured me that the program he was to attend was "set up for our population." Our population. No longer is my family a satellite that rotates around communities we cannot join. No longer is my family excluded from a seat at the proverbial table of agency and choices. NLG welcomes families like mine, families like yours and for that I am endlessly grateful. But gratitude only gets us so far- let's reach deep into our hearts and our wallets and provide NLG with the means to continue its mission so other families can feel the light, warmth, and essential belonging that comes from the NLG community.


